Physicians and Other Medical Providers and Jury Duty

In the State of Virginia there is no provision that excuses physicians and/or other medical providers from serving on a jury. While police officers, firefighters, active members of the military, volunteer members of an ambulance crew or rescue squad, and appointed or elected government officials may be excused, physicians must respond appropriately to a summons for jury service unless they have another valid reason for deferral. The court lists such excusable circumstances to include:

- You care for a child or adult in your custody whose health or safety would be jeopardized by your absence.
- You have a scheduled vacation during your jury service for which you can provide a copy of your airplane ticket or travel itinerary.
- You are a full-time student and can show proof of your enrollment.

These guidelines apply to both local and federal district courts. If you are summonsed and have questions contact the court from which the summons was received for further information or to request an exception, bearing in mind that physicians who are "on call" during the jury service period or who have scheduled patients or procedures will not be excused for those reasons. Arrangements must be made for coverage during that time should you be required to report to the court.

Vaccination Documentation

There are many reasons why complete and detailed vaccination documentation in the medical record is so important including good patient care and safety, to fulfill reporting requirements such as successful reporting to the VDH Immunization Registry (a MIPS, Advancing Care Information requirement), having correct information about the vaccination in the event of a recall, as well as for the facilitation of correct coding and billing. All fields of the Immunization tab should be accurate and complete to include the type of immunization, name of the drug, manufacturer, lot number, NDC number, as well as the site and method of administration and by whom the drug was administered. If the specific type of drug for an immunization is not clearly listed in the appropriate fields it is difficult to report and to choose the correct CPT or HCPCS code for billing purposes. For example, the generic option of "Influenza" should only be used when the vaccine was given by a facility outside of the practice and the brand is unknown.

Tasks are now disclosed as the result of some requests for medical records, whether from the patients, attorneys, or other requesting entities, and anything contained in the task function is subject to review as a legal component of the medical record. Please review with all staff and providers as a reminder
