Day 3: AI & Plagiarism

To avoid plagiarism when using artificial intelligence (AI), it is important to understand what plagiarism is. **Plagiarism** is the act of taking someone else's work and passing it off as your own, intentionally or unintentionally. AI can be used to plagiarize by generating text that is similar to existing text or copying and pasting text **without attribution**.



Avoid plagiarism when using AI by:

- Using AI to generate ideas, not write your work for you
- Verify AI sources and cite all sources you use
- Use a plagiarism checker

Recognize plagiarism when using AI:

- Look for similarities between your work & existing texts
- Be aware of common AI-generated phrases
- Use common sense & err on the side of caution



Always remember to:

- Be transparent with others when you are using AI to generate text
- Use AI responsibly by generating original work & citing sources
