Kevin Dorsey, MD, PhD

Internal Medicine/Rheumatology Dean Emeritus – Southern Illinois University College of Medicine Former Interim President – Southern Illinois System

Dr. J. Kevin Dorsey graduated cum laude with a B.S. in Chemistry from Fairfield University. After completing a PhD in biochemistry at the University of Wisconsin in 1968, Dr. Dorsey served a two-year term in the US Army and completed a postdoctoral fellowship in cell biology at Johns Hopkins University. He then became



one of the founding faculty members of the Southern Illinois University School of Medicine in 1973. Dr. Dorsey went on to pursue an MD degree and graduated from the SIU School of Medicine in 1978. He competed an internal medicine residency and rheumatology fellowship at the University of Iowa before returning to Illinois. Dr. Dorsey practiced rheumatology at the Carbondale Clinic for 15 years while he continued his efforts as a medical educator by teaching freshman medical students. In 2001, he became the third dean of SIU School of Medicine, a position he served until December 2015.


As the Dean Emeritus, Dr. Dorsey continues to teach students internal medicine, rheumatology, and physical examination skills as well as promote empathy and clinical reasoning in the culture of healthcare institutions. Dr. Dorsey began a 1-year term as interim president of the Southern Illinois University system in July 2018. His current research focuses on physician professional behavior and the nature of the supervisor-trainee relationship as it relates to entrustment in the care of patients.

Dr. Dorsey has received a number of honors, including SIU SOM Most Outstanding Clinical Teacher, John Temple Spirituality in Medicine Curricular award, and Southern Illinois Medical Association Favorite Son award. In 2016, he received the SIU School of Medicine's Annual Outstanding Educator Award by the Academy for Scholarship in Education, subsequently renamed the "J. Kevin Dorsey Outstanding Educator Award" in recognition of accomplishments in education.



John Mahoney, MD

With over 25 years at the University of Pittsburgh School of Medicine, John F. Mahoney, MD is Associate Dean for Medical Student Education and an adjunct professor in emergency medicine. He also practices as an attending physician in the emergency department and Vice President of Medical Education



for ScholarRx, which helps medical students prepare for the boards using digital learning on a multi-competency curricular platform.

Dr. Mahoney is a noted expert in medical education and curriculum development, and helped design Pittsburgh's integrated clerkships/ He also led changes in medical education methodology and content that significantly influenced the entire curriculum at the Pittsburgh SOM, and his creativity resulted in hallmark innovations in simulation, public health preparedness, and technology.


Earning his MD at the University of Pittsburgh School of Medicine, Dr. Mahoney completed an internship at Mercy Hospital of Pittsburgh and his residency in emergency medicine at George Washington and George Washington and Georgetown University Hospitals. He also held a teaching fellowship with the Emergency Medicine Foundation/American College of Emergency Physicians, and participated in the Harvard Macy Program for Leaders in Medical Education.



Lois Margaret Nora, MD, JD

Neurology Professor of Neurology President Emeritus and Dean of Medicine Emeritus Northeast Ohio Medical University

Dr. Lois Margaret Nora is Professor of Neurology, President Emeritus, and Dean of Medicine Emeritus at Northeast Ohio Medical University. She also serves as Principal of the Medical School Advisory Group. From 2012-2018, Dr. Nora served as



President and Chief Executive Officer of the American Board of Medical Specialties (ABMS), and during her tenure, the organization initiated the "Continuing Board Certification: Vision for the Future" initiative.

During 2018, Dr. Nora was a Fellow in the Advanced Leadership Initiative at Harvard University, where her work focused on accreditation as a lever for positive change in education. She also continued work on the history of women in medicine. Her earlier work includes appointments as president and dean of Medicine at the Northeast Ohio Medical University (2002-2010), interim president and dean of Commonwealth School of Medicine (now Geisinger Commonwealth School of Medicine), and associate dean of academic affairs and administration and professor of neurology at the University of Kentucky College of Medicine.

Dr. Nora currently serves on the Steering Committee of the National Academy of Medicine's Action Collaborative on Clinician Well-being and Resilience and the Board of Visitors of the University of Mississippi School of Pharmacy. She has served as the President of the American Association of Neuromuscular and Electrodiagnostic Medicine, Chair of HRSA's Council on Graduate Medical Education (COGME), on the Board of Directors of the Association of American Medical Colleges, and as a trustee of the Margaret Clark Morgan Foundation.

Dr. Nora received her medical degree from Rush Medical College, a law degree and certificate in clinical medical ethics from the University of Chicago, and a Master of Business and a master of business administration degree from the University of Kentucky.
